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1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1.1 This report has been prepared by Avian Ecology on behalf of Galileo 03 Ltd (part of Galileo Empower UK Ltd) (hereinafter referred to as 'Galileo' or the 'Applicant'), for the proposed Mynydd Ty-talwyn Energy Park (hereafter 'Proposed Development').
- 1.1.2 This report forms a technical appendix to the **Environmental Statement (ES) Volume II, Chapter 11: Ornithology** for the Proposed Development, and provides the basis for **ES Volume III, Appendix 11.3: Ornithology Collision Risk Modelling Report** (RSK Biocensus, 2025) which also supports the ES.
- 1.1.3 It presents detailed methodologies and results of desk study and field surveys completed to establish baseline ornithological conditions and should be read with reference to the following figures:
- **Figure 1:** Ornithological Statutory Designated Sites;
 - **Figure 2a/b:** VP Flight Activity Survey Plans;
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 - **Confidential Figure C.1:** Breeding Raptor Survey Results (Year 1); and
 - **Confidential Figure C.2:** Breeding Raptor Survey Results (Year 2).
- 1.1.4 Further surveys have been completed by RSK Biocensus between 2024-25, details are provided in **ES Volume III, Appendix 11.2: Wintering Bird Survey report**.
- 1.1.5 Information considered sensitive is presented in **Confidential Figures C.1 and C.2**. Such information will not be made publicly available but will be provided to Natural Resources Wales (NRW) and relevant Local Planning Authorities.
- 1.1.6 Only common species names are used throughout this report. Scientific names for all species referenced (and the conservation status as relevant) are provided in **Annex 1**.

1.2 Key Guidance

1.2.2 In the absence of Welsh-specific guidance, baseline information gathering has been undertaken in accordance with NatureScot guidance (as listed above).

1.3 Target Species

1.3.1 Target species for survey were identified through desk study, the basis of their known or likely presence, their likely sensitivity to the Proposed Development and those which are afforded a higher level of legislative protection, which is in accordance with current NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017 and 2018). Primarily, target species included those species listed on/as:

- Annex I of the EC Birds Directive (2009/147/EC);
- Schedule 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended);
- Species on Section 7 of the Environment (Wales) Act 2016; and
- Red-listed Birds of Conservation Concern (BoCC) (Johnstone *et al.* 2022).

1.3.2 This has ensured inclusion of “*Priority bird species for assessment when considering the development of onshore wind farms in Scotland*” as per NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2018). Despite being produced for Scotland, this methodology remains as best practice guidance for determining target species for onshore wind farms within Wales.

2 METHODOLOGY

2.1 Desk Study

2.1.1 In accordance with NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017), an initial desk study was undertaken to ascertain the presence of statutory designated sites in proximity to the Proposed Development, in order to identify possible target species to inform the requirements for survey.

2.1.2 The desk study included a review of the following key sources summarised in **Table 2-A**.

2.2 Field Surveys

2.2.1 Assessment of potential effects for the Proposed Development to the bird populations, distributions and flight activity will be informed from field surveys detailed in this report undertaken by Avian Ecology between 2021 and 2023 alongside the results from surveys undertaken by RSK Biocensus in 2024/25 within **Volume II, Appendix 11.2: Wintering Bird Report**.

2.2.2 The scope of surveys within this appendix was informed through proximity to designated sites, existing knowledge of sensitive species, and with reference to NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017 and 2018).

2.2.3 The following ornithological field surveys were completed by Avian Ecology:

- Vantage Point (VP) flight activity surveys (November 2021 to October 2022, and November 2022 to June 2023);
- Moorland breeding bird surveys (MBBS) (2022 and 2023);
- Annex 1/Schedule 1 breeding raptor and owl searches (2022 and 2023); and
- Nightjar surveys (2023).

VP Flight Activity Surveys

2.2.4 VP flight activity surveys were undertaken between November 2021 and October 2022, and November 2022 and June 2023 within the Site.

VP Locations and Viewsheds

2.2.5 Three VP locations (VP1, VP2/2a and VP3/3b) were used to provide a comprehensive visual coverage of the required VP survey area required for the Proposed Development in accordance with current NatureScot guidance (2017). During Year 1 surveys (November 2021 to October 2022) and for the first two survey months of Year 2 surveys (November and December 2022) VPs 1-3 were used, as illustrated in **Figure 2a/b**. From, and including, January/February 2023 to November 2023, VP2a and VP3b were used to respectively replace VP2 and VP3 due to access restrictions. Information regarding the VPs used are detailed within **Table 2-B**.

VP Survey Effort

2.2.6 The total survey effort (hours) completed at each VP location between 2021 and 2023 is summarised in **Table 2-C**.

2.2.7 Full details of all survey times and weather conditions are presented in **Annex 2**.

2.2.8 Survey effort in Year 1 (2021-2022) and Year 2 (2022-2023) exceeded the minimum recommended survey effort outlined within NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017) i.e. a minimum of 72 hours per VP location divided between breeding and non-breeding seasons.

2.2.9 Survey times were dispersed throughout the day and were also completed in a range of weather conditions, but always conducive to survey and safe access.

2.2.10 In accordance with NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017), flight lines were mapped for all target species passing through the VP survey area. Details of species, number of birds, flight height in bands, duration and direction were noted on standardised recording forms and field plans.

2.2.11 The following height bands (HT) were used in the field from November 2021 to March 2023 to record target species activity at, below or above collision risk height for subsequent use in the calculation of collision mortality risks.

- HT1: 0-60 m;
- HT2: 61-90 m;
- HT3: 91-180 m;
- HT4: 181-200 m; and
- HT5: >200.

2.2.12 Note the following height bands were used from April 2023 until October 2023 to account for potentially higher turbine tips.

- HT1: 0-40 m;
- HT2: 41-90 m;
- HT3: 91-180 m;
- HT4: 181-200 m;
- HT5: 201-280 m; and
- HT6: >280 m.

Target Species

2.2.13 Target species for recording included all Annex 1/Schedule 1 raptors (plus kestrel from part-way through Year 1 following the species moving onto the BoCC Red List in Wales; Johnstone *et al.* (2022)), waders, swans, geese, ducks (excl. mallard and feral species) as observed during VP watches.

Secondary Species

2.2.14 Secondary species were also noted in approximately fifteen-minute summary intervals, with the number of birds present and general behaviour recorded in order to build an overall picture of activity. Fifteen-minute periods were considered appropriate to ensure surveyors were fully alert to target species activity, which took priority during survey.

2.2.15 Secondary species are defined here as commoner raptors (e.g. buzzard and sparrowhawk), all gulls, feral species, mallard, raven, and grey heron, along with any large concentrations of Schedule 1 or Red-listed passerines as observed during survey.

Moorland Breeding Bird Surveys

2.2.16 Moorland breeding bird surveys (MBBSs) were undertaken in 2022 and 2023.

2.2.17 The MBBS survey area in both survey years has comprised coverage of the Site and accessible areas of open habitats within 500 m, as shown in **Figure 3**.

2.2.18 The methodology employed followed an adapted Brown and Shepherd (1993) method for censusing upland breeding waders, based upon the recommendations set out in Calladine *et al.* (2009) and as recommended in NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017). The methodology is suitable for moorland and open country species including, waders, gulls, red grouse and some wildfowl species however, incidental observations of any raptors, owls or notable passerines (i.e. Schedule 1, BoCC red-listed and Section 7 species^{1,2}) were also recorded.

2.2.19 A series of four staggered visits were completed during each survey year, between April and July each year.

2.2.20 During each survey visit a pre-determined route was walked through the survey area, with all birds seen or heard, and their behaviours (e.g. displaying, carrying food etc.) were mapped in the field.

2.2.21 All surveys were undertaken during daylight hours and in fine conditions conducive to survey. Surveys were typically timed to capture the main period optimal for MBBS (08:30-18:00 hrs), in accordance with standard guidance (NatureScot, 2017). This ensured that the time when target species (described above) are most active was appropriately covered by the survey period. Survey effort is summarised in **Table 2-D**. Surveys were sometimes undertaken over 2-3 days given the extent of the MBBS survey area. Full details of all survey times, field surveyors and weather conditions are presented in **Annex 2**.

Annex 1/ Schedule 1 Breeding Raptor and Owl Searches

2.2.22 Breeding raptor and owl searches were undertaken in 2022 and 2023 with reference to species-specific methodologies outlined in Hardey *et al.* (2013), as per NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017).

2.2.23 A series of search visits were made during each survey year, staggered across the core breeding season (March to July).

2.2.24 The breeding raptor and owl survey area in both survey years has comprised coverage of the Site and accessible areas within 2 km, as shown in **Figures C.2**.

2.2.25 All surveys were undertaken during daylight hours and in fine conditions conducive to survey. Some surveys were timed to include times close to dusk to capture any evidence of owls. Survey effort is summarised in **Table 2-E**. Full details of all survey times, field surveyors and weather conditions are presented in **Annex 2**.

Nightjar Survey

2.2.26 Nightjar surveys were carried out with reference to species-specific methodologies outlined in Gilbert *et al.* (1998) and comprised two survey visits (one at dusk and one at dawn) in 2023, in favourable conditions.

2.2.27 The nightjar survey area has comprised coverage of the Site and accessible areas of suitable habitat (including clear-fell and regenerating plantation) within 500 m, where accessible. Habitats within the survey area considered most suitable for nightjar were surveyed, and comprised any clear-felled areas within forestry, and young forestry typically less than 15 years old and open rides.

2.2.28 The survey was undertaken along a pre-determined transect through the survey area and stopping at listening points adjacent to suitable breeding habitats, where singing ('churring') males were listened for. The survey was targeted in those forestry habitats within, and adjoining, the west of the Site.

2.2.29 Survey effort is summarised in **Table 2-F**. Full details of all survey times, field surveyors and weather conditions are presented in **Annex 2**.

Field Survey Personnel

2.2.30 All field surveys have been completed by experienced and professional ornithologists named in **Annex 2**; all of whom are all fully conversant in recognised bird survey methodologies for proposed wind turbine developments.

Other Surveys

2.2.31 No further field surveys were undertaken. In accordance with standard NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017) winter walkover surveys were not carried out, given the Site is not within 20 km of any designated site with qualifying migratory goose interests. Furthermore, the ornithology surveys (VP flight activity surveys) were undertaken during the winter period which would have recorded any such bird use of the Site.

Field Survey Limitations

2.2.32 VP2 had to be relocated to VP2a, and VP3 to VP3b due to access restrictions in January 2023 and February 2023 respectively, during Year 2. The movement of VP2 to VP2a and VP3 to VP3b were modest alterations, with only slight changes to the viewsheds. These are not considered limitations given the VP viewshed coverage remained sufficient of the proposed layout at the time of survey.

- 2.2.33 For the Year 2 breeding season, different height bands were used, from those used in Year 1, given evolving turbine specification considerations at the time of production. As the candidate turbine model were expected to have a rotor swept area of between 37 m and 200 m the inclusion of flightlines recorded during the surveys between 2021-2023 within HT1 in detailed collision risk modelling were necessary. Further discussion in regards to collision risk modelling of this potential limitation is provided in **Volume II, Appendix 11.3: Ornithology Collision Risk Modelling**.
- 2.2.34 Survey hours between some of the VPs did not match, although annual hours at each VP exceeded 72 hours (and spread across the breeding and non-breeding seasons) which is the minimum requirement as per NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017). No limitation in relation to VP hours is thus considered.
- 2.2.35 During the Year 1 MBBS only ground-nesting wetland species were recorded (although extended to include Red list passerines). During the Year 2 MBBS, the target species was extended to include all species, and included ground-nesting wetland species and all passerines. Considering all passerines is highly precautionary as passerines are not considered to be sensitive to wind farm developments, in addition MBBS were repeated in year 2 and did record all passerine species. Therefore, the MBBS surveys are considered to be sufficient for providing an ornithological baseline for the passerine assemblage present within the Site that could potentially be of relevance to the solar farm in the assessment of effects.
- 2.2.36 Nightjar surveys were only undertaken in Year 2 (and not Year 1). Given the survey results obtained, which identified Nightjars, one year of surveys is considered to have appropriately identified those habitats, within the survey area, most suitable for, and supporting, breeding nightjar. We therefore can conclude Nightjar are present and assess the impacts accordingly.
- 2.2.37 Preliminary digital elevation models (DEM) of the VP viewshed coverage from the VPs were created using a 20 m above the ground altitudinal cut off. The viewshed coverage at each VP location was ground-truthed on-site by surveyors, to ensure the viewshed coverage modelled was representative of the actual coverage, after factoring in the location of trees and hedgerows. The VP viewshed coverage was accordingly amended. The viewshed coverage shows that the vast majority of the VP survey area is visible with only very limited 'blind spots' (which is typical due to undulating topography and trees). These are very minor in extent and flight activity of target species around these turbines would still have been observed.
- 2.2.38 All habitats within the Site were accessible for survey. Access to and observations of most areas outside the Site (including out to 2 km for breeding raptor and owl searches) was possible from suitable locations within the Site or public rights of way (PRoWs), scanning areas with the use of optics (telescope and binoculars). Given the good visibility across the survey area from within the Site and the PRoWs this is not considered a limitation to the results obtained.
- 2.2.39 A settling-in period was applied prior to the start of VP flight activity surveys to minimise the likelihood for surveyor presence to influence bird activity. Furthermore, VPs were located where viewshed visibility could be maximised, while keeping as inconspicuous to birds as possible (both VPs were positioned by field boundaries to avoid influencing bird activity).
- 2.2.40 Overall, no limitations to the dataset in establishing an accurate reflection of the levels of target species activity within proximity to the Proposed Development, and respective survey areas.

3 RESULTS

3.1 Desk Study

- 3.1.1 This section provides details of existing ornithological information and existing records of protected and notable bird species identified within and in proximity to the Site from desk study sources listed in **Table 2-A**.

Statutory Designated Sites for Nature Conservation

- 3.1.2 This section should be read with reference to **Figure 1**.
- 3.1.3 A review of the 'MAGIC' and NRW websites identifies that the Site does not form part of any statutory designated site for nature conservation with qualifying ornithological qualifying features.
- 3.1.4 **Table 3-A** summarises statutory designated sites with ornithological qualifying features. Distances specified within **Table 3-A** are taken from the Site boundary to the designation boundary at its nearest point.
- 3.1.5 There are no internationally designated sites with qualifying migratory waterfowl features located within 20 km of the Site.

3.2 Field Surveys

This section presents the results of baseline field surveys, including an overview of birds present within adopted survey areas and their distribution.

VP Flight Activity Surveys

Target Species

- 3.2.1 Target species flight activity recorded during the entire VP survey period (November 2021 to October 2022, and November 2022 to October 2023) from all VPs combined is summarised in **Table 3-B**. The total number of flights, total number of birds and total flight duration recorded (across all height bands) is presented. This includes some flights which were detected outside of the VP survey area and which are not at-risk of collision from the Proposed Development. The most regularly recorded species was red kite (165 flights, including a displaying pair), lapwing (31 flights, including displaying birds) and grey heron (13 flights), with other target species recorded in modest numbers (≤5 flights).
- 3.2.2 Detailed flight records are presented in **Annex 3**, with flight lines illustrated in **Figures 4a-b**.

Secondary Species

3.2.3 The following secondary species were also recorded:

- Lesser black-backed gull;
- Great black-backed gull;
- Herring gull;
- Common gull;
- Black-headed gull;
- Buzzard;
- Sparrowhawk; and
- Raven.

Moorland Breeding Bird Surveys

3.2.4 In summary, the MBBS survey area supported a very narrow assemblage of breeding species considered typical of the locale and habitats present. The only ground-nesting wader recorded as breeding was lapwing, with four breeding pairs in both Year 1 and Year 2, with the location of the breeding lapwing pairs shown in **Figures 5a-b**. Of these, conclusive evidence of breeding (nest site and/or young recorded) was identified for two and one lapwing pair respectively in Year 1 and Year 2. All apart from one of the breeding pairs were within the Site boundary. All other breeding species recorded, were passerines, such as skylark and meadow pipit (which in accordance with NatureScot guidance (SNH, 2017) are not considered sensitive to wind farm developments). Records of other species recorded during the MBBS is provided in **Table 3-C**, and BoCC Amber and Red list species⁵ records (those listed in **bold** in **Table 3-C**) are shown in **Figures 5c-5h**. Of those species recorded during the MBBS, all of those listed in **Table 3-C** are during Year 2, with only spotted flycatcher recorded in Year 1 (but see *Limitations* section).

Annex 1 / Schedule 1 Breeding Raptor and Owl Searches

- 3.2.5 In Year 1 (2022) the survey area was found to support a goshawk breeding territory, with nest site located within the Site, red kite breeding territory (with suspected nest site in woodland habitat adjacent to the Site) and two possible barn owl nest/roost sites within 2 km of the Site (with one close to the Site boundary). These records are provided in **Confidential Figure C1**. Other records in Year 1 consisted of a male merlin and hunting kestrel (and another kestrel perched in a conifer), although there was no evidence of breeding of these two species within the survey area.
- 3.2.6 In Year 2 (2023) the survey area was found to support a red kite breeding territory (with nest site within the Site). This record is provided in **Confidential Figure C2**. Other records in Year 2 consisted of an over-flying kestrel, although there was no evidence of breeding within the survey area.

Nightjar Survey

- 3.2.7 Nightjar surveys in 2023 recorded six churring male nightjars within forestry within the survey area. Furthermore, five nightjar flights and two female nightjars were also recorded in habitat associated with the churring males. The records from the surveys are provided in **Figure 6**.

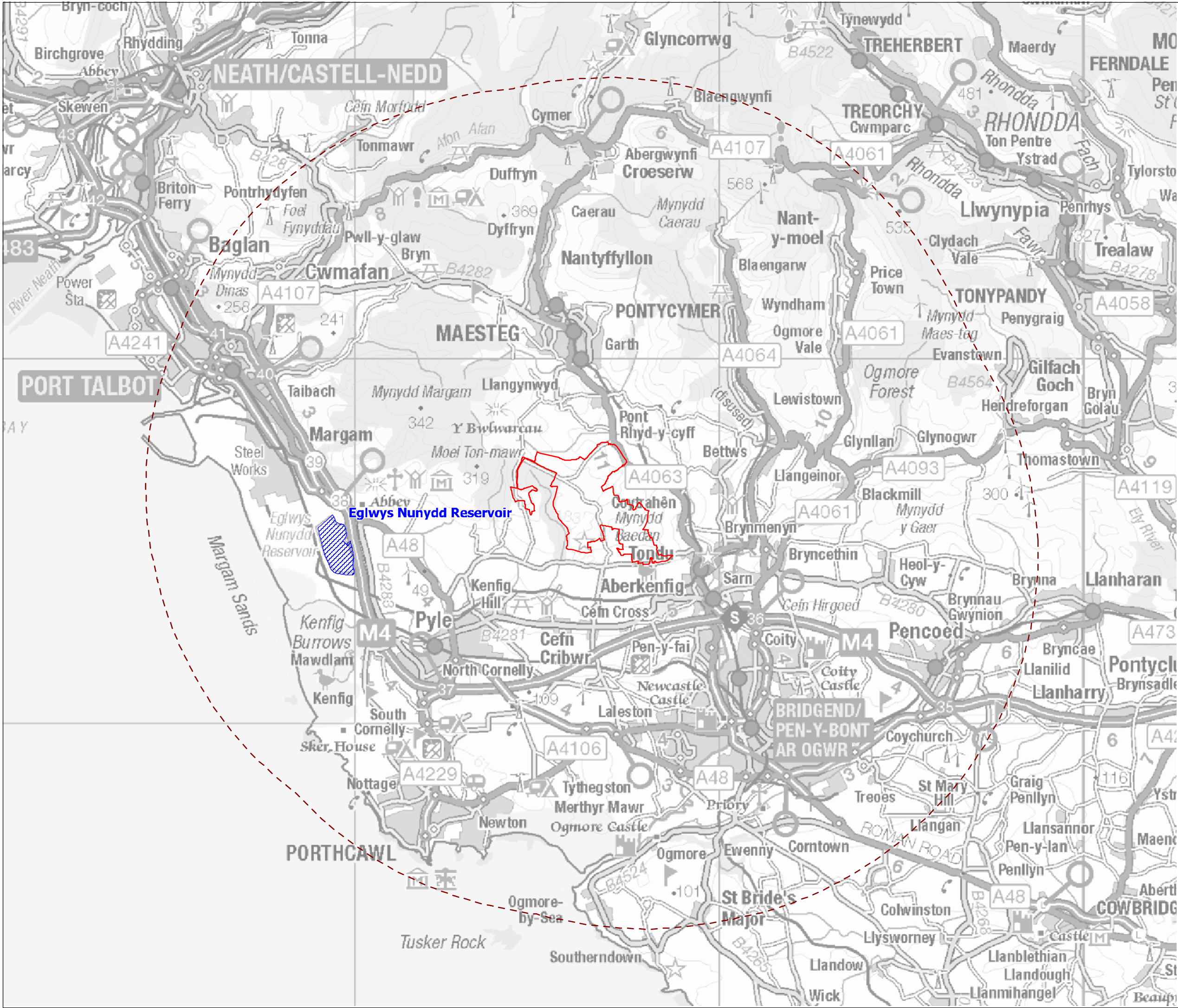

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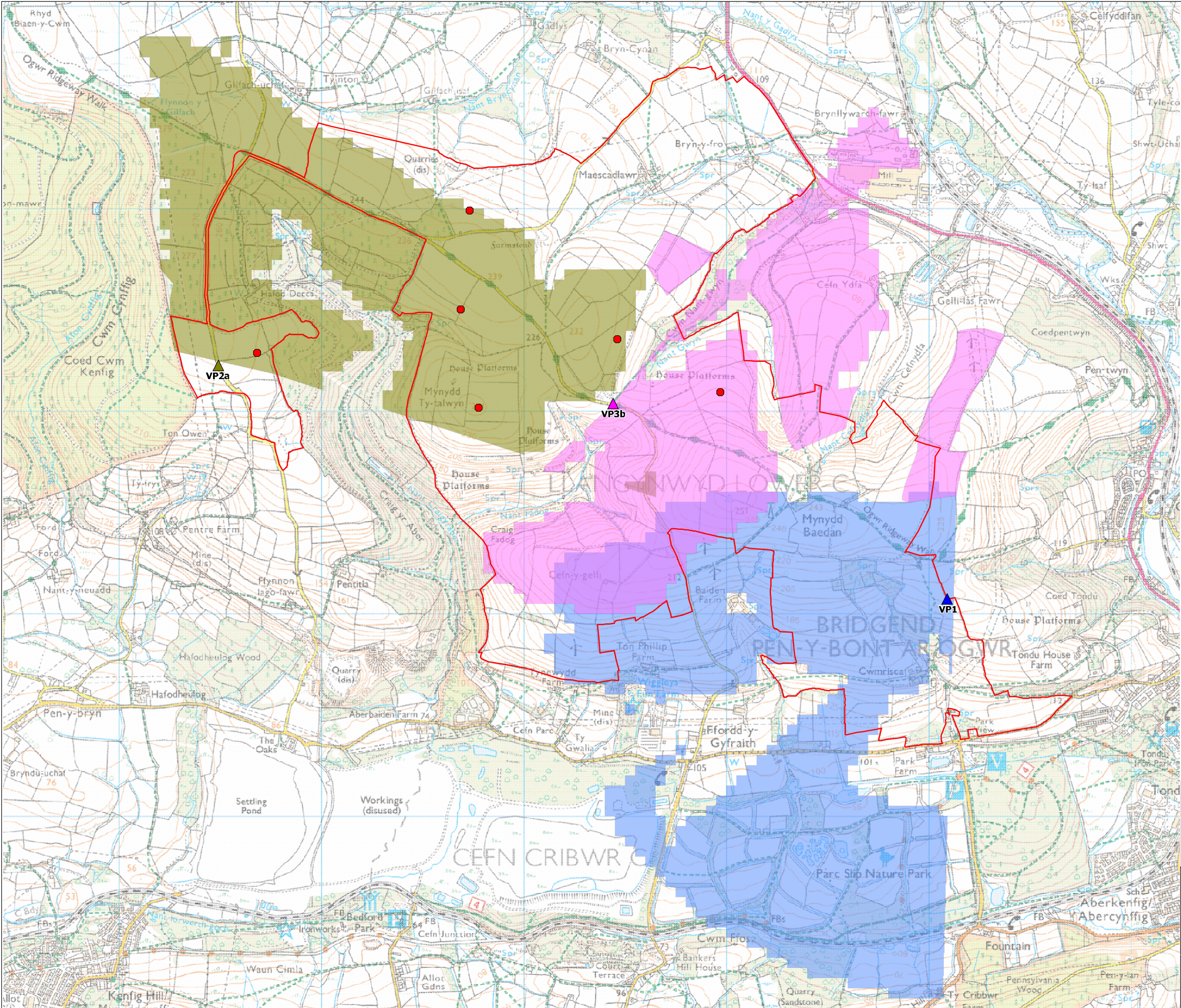

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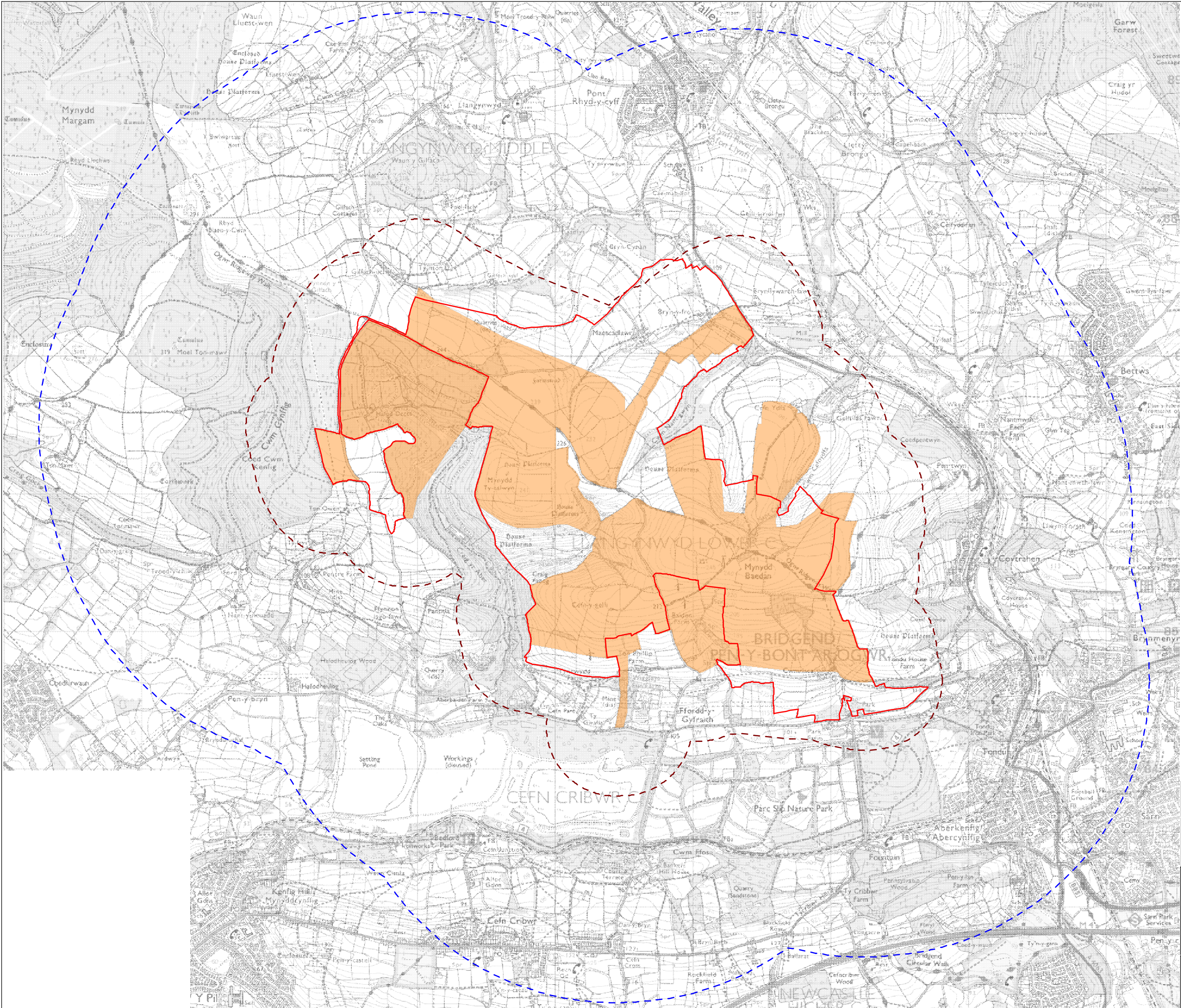
